***Our mission is to provide your child with an enjoyable and safe program dedicated to nurturing an environmental ethic and a respect for nature.***

Qualified staff with a ratio of 1:10 (instructors to children) to a maximum of 30 campers, ages 6 – 11, will conduct sessions with a different environmental theme each week and will include fun activities, crafts and outdoor adventures. A daily swim in our supervised pool will help cool the campers and add to the fun.

Campers will need to bring their own litter-free snacks, drinks and lunch each day (recycling facilities available). It is best that you pack items that do not require refrigeration. **Note: we are a peanut-safe facility and do not permit any foods that contain nuts or traces of nuts.**



For your child's protection . . . SLIP. . . SLAP . . . SLOP  
Remember to slip on a shirt, slap on a hat and slop on the sunscreen.  
Campers are encouraged to bring sunscreen (SPF30) and a hat to camp every day.

It is the goal of our staff to provide your child with an enjoyable and safe program. Parents can help by following these simple guidelines.

- Children must have reached the age of 6 before 1 January, 2010.
- Do not cause your child undue worry. Be sure to drop off and pick up your child at the designated times.
- For your child's comfort and protection, no open toed shoes. Be sure to include hats, sunscreen and extra beverages in their backpack.
- All camps continue to operate during inclement weather. Please dress your child accordingly.
- For your child's well being, make sure staff is aware of any allergies or medications.
- **Make sure our staff is informed of any family or behavioural concerns.** Our staff will make every effort to accommodate your child's needs, however we reserve the right to withdraw your child from the program should their behaviour cause harm to themselves, participants, staff or property.
- It is the policy of the Frontenac Arch Biosphere Nature Camp to create a safe, nurturing environment for both campers and staff. Behaviour that is emotionally or physically harmful either to a camper or to a staff member will not be tolerated. This will include inappropriate behaviour such as bullying, harassment, acts of aggression or disrespect for other people or the environment. If a camper is verbally or physically abusive a warning will be given. This will be documented and a note will be sent home. The second time a camper is talked to, parents will be called and there will be consequences. If the camper repeats the offense a third time he or she will be asked to leave the camp. There will be no refund on camp fees.

## **Landon Bay Nature Camp Theme Summary 2010**

### **Week 1 (July 5 – July 9)**

#### **Transformers of the Natural World**

Amazing transformations are not limited to the realm of robots and science fiction, they take place in the natural world all around us. Learn about the fascinating lifecycles of amphibians, insects and a host of other changeable creatures.

### **Week 2 (July 12 – July 16)**

#### **Weather Watch**

How does a storm cloud form and what makes the wind blow? Learn this and more through observation and experiments during a week devoted to the mysteries of weather.

### **Week 3 (July 19 – July 23)**

#### **Slithery Slimy Fun**

Reptiles, amphibians and other slippery creatures are the stars of this program. Participants will learn about local species in their natural habitat.

### **Week 4 (July 26 – July 30)**

#### **A Winter World**

It's hot outside, but this week is as cool as can be with a focus on animal adaptations to the wintry months and the science behind snow and ice.

### **Week 5 (August 2 – August 6)**

#### **Take Flight!**

In summer the skies are full of bird life. Time will fly as you learn about birds: how to identify them, their fascinating habits, and their beautiful diversity.

### **Week 6 (August 9 – August 13)**

#### **The Green Machines**

Did you know that trees are the longest-living things on the planet? Not only that, but they help provide the air we breathe! Join us to find out more about these gentle green giants and their smaller plant friends.

### **Week 7 (August 16 – August 20)**

#### **Food for Thought**

Eating is top of mind in this program. The importance of food sources for us and other living things will be highlighted, and children will learn about eating locally with a chance to sample the great tastes of the 1000 Islands region.

### **Week 8 (August 23 – August 27)**

#### **Micro and Macro**

This week is all about extremes, from the largest plants and animals in the region, to the tiniest microscopic life that carries on unseen right under our noses.
